



# RESIDENTIAL TRASH & RECYCLING GUIDELINES

- \* Recycling of aluminum, glass, plastic, paper and cardboard is mandatory in Mountain Village.
- \* Trash is picked up Mondays between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- \* Place trash out on Monday morning so wildlife is not attracted.
- \* If you are unsure whether a specific material is recyclable or not, do not place the questionable item in the recycle bin.
- \* Recycling costs less than trash - increase the size of your recycling bin and decrease the size of your trash bin to save money while helping the environment.
- \* If your trash was not collected, call Bruin Waste Management at 800.559.2149 to schedule another pick up time (fees may apply).
- \* If Christmas falls on a Monday, pickup will be the following day.

## RECYCLING STEPS

- ✓ Empty and rinse containers.
- ✓ Remove caps and lids.
- ✓ Remove labels from bottles and cans, if possible.
- ✓ Flatten boxes.
- ✓ Remove non-recyclable packing materials, such as peanuts and foam.
- ✓ Keep paper and cardboard together and to the side of the commingled items.

The Town of Mountain Village requires all residential properties to recycle according to the above guidelines.

<b>ALUMINUM, TIN &amp; STEEL</b>	aluminum/tin cans, metal lids and bottle tops	aluminum foil aluminum trays
<b>GLASS</b>	colored and clear glass bottles and jars	mirrors, vases, ceramics or windows glassware or kitchen plates ceramics
<b>PLASTICS</b>	recyclable plastics labeled #1 – #7	plastic wrap, plastic bags, plastic caps or lids recyclable coffee lids plastic packaging without a recycling symbol Styrofoam
<b>PAPER &amp; CARDBOARD</b>	newspapers, advertisements, magazines, phone books, envelopes, brochures/pamphlets, file folders, card stock egg cartons shredded paper – placed in paper bag cardboard pizza boxes (take food out) paper towel and toilet paper rolls	cartons with waxy coating (ice cream, milk, juice) paper coffee cups paper towels construction paper photographs compostable cups, plates or utensils
<b>OTHER ITEMS</b>	coat hangers wire	ice cube trays corks batteries and electronic waste (e-waste) fabric appliances dog food and dog waste bags
