### Hello all,

Please see the link to our marketing grant database <a href="https://airtable.com/shr24uZfJawmfjZ6W">https://airtable.com/shr24uZfJawmfjZ6W</a>. Kathrine is in charge of processing these funds. All earmarked funds were exhausted 9/1. Third party vendors must invoice the Town directly, not the businesses themselves, in order to be reimbursed for their work. This way we confirm that the funds are being spent on what was approved. As discussed in BDAC, we can choose to extend this program to more businesses and broaden the applicable businesses should we want to use the CVRF funds that way.

For a breakdown of the BDAC stimulus fund please see the google sheet. Only budget and actual totals are shown, not a list of every expense. This would be in Incode. Below is what I submitted in the grant application but as I mentioned, the total is what matters (\$791,770.00). As long as the fund go toward a line item that was described in the application, the total does not matter. So for instance, if there funds left over from reimbursement of the Town's portion of the BDAC efforts, we can choose to not extend any additional grants and simply cover TMVOA's match. We can purchase additional structures, etc. However, as Dan mentioned, we need to ensure the actuals for each expense line item are correct before we truly know what surplus of funds remain. We then can decided how to allocate.

### JD, can you update the spreadsheet by Tuesday of next week, and make sure the actuals are correct for the following?

- Summer Village Center outdoor space enhancement
- Private Gondola Dining Cabins (Gondola Shop)
- Pop-up Pavilions/ Rentals (Weatherport)
- Plaza Infrastructure Updates
- Seasonal Plaza Service Covid-19 Cleaning Staff

### CVRF GRANT APPLICATION BREAKDOWN

### REIMBURSEMENT

- Summer Enhancement (\$40,000) Expanded the use of our outdoor pubic plazas to generate the necessary structures and ambiance for restaurants and retail to extend their services.
- Marketing Assistance Fund (\$30,000) Provide businesses promotional support and prepare for ecommerce through grant to approved brick and mortar, street-level business within the Village Center or Market Plaza. Cap \$2500
- Customer Incentive Program (\$2,500) To incentivize vitality and encourage socially distanced activities, the Town
  provided live music throughout the public plazas.
- Heating Assistance Fund (\$35,000) -Provide approved brick and mortar, street-level restaurant businesses with 25 or fewer
  employees within the Village Center or Market Plaza funds for investing in outdoor heating elements to assist with capacity
  restrictions. Cap 50% match up to \$7000.
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- Pop-up Pavilions/ Rentals (\$144,723) Considering safety concerns of snow load and high winds within our mountainous environment, the Town wanted to ensure properly engineered temporary structures for the use of expanded dining. The Town then purchased the temporary structures and a rental program was developed at a nominal monthly fee to restaurants.
- Plaza Infrastructure Updates (\$70,000) Necessary for the operation of plaza enhancement elements.
- Seasonal Plaza Service Covid-19 Cleaning Staff (\$41,472.00) Two new seasonal deliciated staff to sanitize public
  infrastructure and assist in COVID mitigation strategies throughout the public plazas.

- Marketing Assistance Fund (\$150,000)- The current grant pool served 12 businesses; additional funding would open the program to any operating Mountain Village business license holder.
- Heating Assistance Fund (\$150,000)- The current grant pool only serves small restaurant businesses; with additional funding, we can open to retail and other larger businesses.

**Subject:** BDAC Expenses

All,

Laila and I have now gone over the documents you have provided. Thanks very much. They were very helpful. We will discuss where we are financially at next Wednesday's BDAC meeting.

We believe that, with the grant funds applied to what we have spent so far, we have about \$375K that we need to spend by December 30. But to be sure of that number, a few questions:

- 1. Marketing Assistance Fund How much billing is outstanding? For up-to-date details refer to the Marketing Assistance Fund Database, Kathrine is updating as invoices come in. As of now we have approved \$29,800 to 12 businesses, \$12,300 has been reimbursed, leaving \$17,500 outstanding. Given the current spending rate, how close to budget are we likely to come? From speaking with businesses, I believe all will spend the marketing dollars approved, they are just slow to send in their invoices. Are there businesses that would make use of more money than they have received or new businesses that might apply? I have heard from at least 3 businesses they could use more money, and two that missed the deadline but would like to apply for funds. We are considering increasing this, but not if no one wants the funds.
- 2. **Customer Incentive Fund** Forgot what this is--don't see it on the Business Resources web page. This was the broad term for the Sunset Stroll. The Town's portion only came to \$2,500 and TMVOA is taking over the cost for the winter season.

- 3. Heating Assistance Fund What is the status? For up-to-date details refer to the <a href="Heating Assistance Fund Database">Heating Assistance Fund Database</a>, Amy and John are updating as applications /invoices come in. Have we earmarked all the funds? No, only \$12,000 has been approved with one outstanding application for \$7,000 Are there restaurants that could use more or restaurants that have applied and not used the funds? There are restaurants that have not applied that said they would, prior to my leave. I have also had a retail establishment ask for funds (Black Tie)
- 4. **Town employee costs** How do we capture these and use the expenses against the grant monies? It would be the reimbursement of salary (up to Jan 1) for a Town employee. Double check with Patrick but if we go the third-party contract route perhaps we can pay the total amount of the contract upfront and use the funds to reimburse for cleaning services (despite services taking place in 2021)
- 5. Accelerating Pavilion Construction With the sudden popularity of the Cabins, the construction of the pavilions becomes increasingly important. Can we speed up their construction if we pay more to get WeatherPort employees (or others) to help or replace our crews? I am sure we could, JD could you ask Erik (you probably already have)
- 6. **Additional Dining Cabins** If we were to order 5 more, how quickly could we get them and where would they go? We assume a major factor is where else we can source electricity. Dom said yes, third week of January.

Hello All,

The google sheet for the BDAC Stimulus Budget that Zoe set up has been updated and can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here.</a>. This sheet includes actuals as well as anticipated expenses to finish out our current projects. While the final number will vary slightly, it should provide a good ballpark of expenditures and remaining grant funds. I created a second sheet that itemized expenses if you would like to see a more detailed breakdown.

Please note that I did not include a number for seasonal plaza services cleaning staff — I think we will need a quick discussion once Garrett finalizes TSG's security team's availability to provide cleaning services and we also need to make a decision on hiring AJAX for daily cleanings. To this point we have had little interest in our Winter Seasonal position so it may be a better use of funds to divert to these alternative cleaning/sanitizing uses.

The only other plug I would make for a potential expenditure would be to consider purchasing some additional plaza furniture and umbrellas for summer use. I think there are a few more locations, i.e. the Gondola Plaza, where we could benefit from a few more pieces of furniture. We could also consider replacing some of our furniture that is nearing the end of its useful life to match the new look. I'm happy to discuss further or put together a proposal.
