




The Survey

42 questions measuring community engagement & behavioral health needs

606 total surveys completed

 - "Low Income" reflects those living under 200% of the federal poverty level, based on guidelines established by the US Department of Health & Human Services.
 - All Hispanic respondents are grouped, regardless of identity with any other race group. Race reflects those who identify with a single race category, without Hispanic origin. "Diverse Races" includes those who identify as Black or African American, American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, or as being of multiple races, without Hispanic origin.

- Rating of community as a place to live
 - ~70% Excellent, Very Good
 - ~23% Good
 - 7.7% Fair, Poor (1.1%)



 - 82.6% completely, mostly
 - 17.4% Somewhat, not at all(2%)



 - Lower in the West End but still a majority

 - 72.2% Completely, Mostly



 - Trying to be a part of the community is the norm
 - Higher in some areas, yes, but...
 - Lower in West End, lower with low income
 - Is this a product of the way we define being a part of the community & would we see a different result if we asked a different question?

- Identity
 - 30.5% Completely
 - 33% Mostly
 - ~30% Somewhat
 - ~7% Not at all



Social Connections & Loneliness


- Loneliness






Housing Instability

- Worrying about steady living for the next 6 months
 - 17.4% strongly/somewhat agree
 - More so in Telluride/MV

Food Insecurity

- Ran out of food without resources to buy more
 - 18.4% often, sometimes
 - ~33% nationally
 - Most often reported by women, adults aged 18-39, Hispanic residents, and low-income households



Mental Health: Community Attitudes

- People...are generally caring & sympathetic to people with mh concerns
 - 18.7% Strongly agree
 - 49.3% Somewhat agree
 - ~20% Neither agree/disagree*
 - 9% Somewhat disagree
 - 3.5% Strongly disagree
 - Lower in the West End at 57.4%

- What norms are revealed here?
 - The norm is that the community is caring
 - *What about these in-betweens?




Mental Health: Community Attitudes

- "It is easy for residents to talk about mental health or emotional challenges"
 - 8% Strongly agree
 - 41.8% Somewhat agree
 - 27.3% Neither*
 - 16.5% Somewhat disagree
 - 6.4% Strongly disagree
 - Lower in the West End




Mental Health: Personal

- Days of poor mental health (stress, depression, problems with emotion)
 - 32.8% None
 - 18.8% 1 to 2
 - 48.4% 3 or more /30 days
 - Higher in Telluride/MV, among women and adults 18-39


Three or More Days of Poor Mental Health in the Past Month (West Mountain Region, 2024)



Mental Health: Resources

- Awareness of Resources
 - ~79% aware of local resources for Mental Health
 - Slightly lower in West End, among Hispanic residents, & low income
- Likelihood of Using Local Resources
 - ~43% Very likely
 - ~43% Somewhat likely
 - ~15% Not Likely
 - ~86% likely to use services but perceive it being difficult to talk about

Mental Health: Resources


- 40% need services
 - 32% unable to find (68% were)

Top reasons for not getting needed services:


- Cos

- Greatest challenge to overall health & wellbeing?
 - 16.6% Nothing
 - 10.4% Income
 - ~20% Stress (Work + Family)
 - ~10% Physical Health
 - ~7% Isolation/Loneliness
 - 6.6% Mental Health
 - 6.5% Employment/Security
 - 6.4% Housing
 - ~12% Various other specifics
 - ~6% Unsure

Mental Health: Resources

- Using teletherapy
 - ~43% Very likely
 - ~40% Somewhat likely
 - 17.5% Not likely
 - No difference between West End & Telluride/MV



Substance Use: Alcohol

Personal Use

- Current: at least 1 drink in the last 30 days
- Heavy: More than 2 per day/1 per day in the last 30 days
- Binge: 5 or more/4 or more on a single occasion
- Excessive: heavy or binge in the last 30 days



 - 80% say important, majority not heavy drinking, binge, or excessive




Substance Use: Personal Impacts

- Degree to which life has been negatively affected by substance use (self or other)
 - 23.3% A great deal
 - 30% Somewhat
 - 22.6% A little
 - 24% Not at all

Shared Measurement Framework

Dashboard – KAF Tableau

- PRC Key Findings
 - High engagement & identity in communities
 - Housing instability and food insecurity around 20%
 - 4/10 are lonely
 - A majority believe the community is sympathetic but less feel it is easy for residents to discuss*
 - High number of poor mental health days
 - Majority aware of resources and most say they would likely see them
 - About 1/3 of those who needed mental health services last year were unable to find them
 - Alcohol strongly associated with community life*
 - 40% engage in "excessive drinking"
 - Substance use has a high level of impact

Future Leverage Points- there is room to highlight the positive norms in our community and correct misperceptions
